around Victoria.


It was a rare opportunity for members to mingle with an expert as knowledgeable as Greg and several members brought items for inspection, one piece in particular which highly impressed Greg.

Interest I found in NLA Trove, Sandeman wines being advertised in Australia since the 1830's. We toured the cellars and found the wines very nice indeed, but even

nicer was the huge collection of sealed onion and mallet bottles on display – my mouth drooled for the wine and the bottles.

The owners must have put out a curator to build such a large and varied collection, and my wife knew exactly where I would be when the others on tour asked "Where's Tony?" Well worth a visit if you're ever in Porto!
